1. Narrative description of the Prop 28 arts education program(s) funded. (2500 character limit).

During the 2025–26 school year, \$6,868.12 in Proposition 28 funds were strategically used to expand and enhance our school's arts education offerings and provide students with meaningful, hands-on experiences in visual and performing arts. Funding supported the Art on the Go class experience, ACE Hollywood Experience, ACE Photography Experience, the Mission Art Contest, a student theater trip to see Harry Potter, transportation for arts-focused field trips and industry experiences, and the purchase of art supplies and materials needed to support these activities. Through our Art & Creative Engagement (ACE) partnership, students participated in engaging, culturally responsive experiences designed to strengthen creativity, artistic expression, critical thinking, social-emotional development, and post-secondary awareness. The ACE Photography Experience gave students opportunities to work with and learn from professional photographers and freelance entrepreneurs, explore photography careers, use professional SLR cameras and lenses, practice studio lighting and composition, and capture original photographs in both studio and outdoor settings. The ACE Hollywood Experience expanded learning beyond the classroom by exposing students to significant street art and public murals throughout Los Angeles. Students met professional graffiti artists and muralists, participated in a hands-on graffiti art workshop, collaborated with peers to create original artwork, and learned about the social impact and community-building power of public art. Additional experiences, including the Mission Art Contest, Art on the Go activities, and a live theater experience, provided students with multiple opportunities to create, explore, and experience the arts. Looking ahead to the 2026–27 school year, we plan to continue expanding our arts offerings and increase student participation through our partnership with Roos Music. Students will have access to music instruction in areas such as piano, electric and acoustic guitar, drums, voice, ukulele, bass guitar, violin, viola, and cello. Through the continued use of Proposition 28 funding, our school remains committed to providing inclusive and engaging arts education that promotes creativity, artistic expression, career exploration, collaboration, and meaningful real-world learning experiences.
